
PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – TERM 1 WEEK 3

After school Pick up at the Loading Zone



Here are some alternative Drop off and Pick up options:

ALTERNATIVE DROP OFF & PICK UP OPTIONS

If you need to travel to school by car, try parking a short distance away from the school. This helps reduce traffic congestion and makes the school entrance safer for tamariki and whānau. Find a drop off and pick up point that works for your family. Practice using it in the weekend and make a plan.

ARA KĒ ATU TRANSPORT WEEK

Let's get active! Next week 14th-17th February we will take part in Ara Kē Atu challenge. This is an active transport challenge for schools. Ara Kē Atu means 'an alternative pathway'. The challenge encourages using sustainable active modes of transport to get around, such as biking, walking, scootering, bussing, skating, and park and ride, instead of driving. It introduces students to sustainable travel in a fun, achievable, everyday setting. Ara Kē Atu: encourages independence and resilience in tamariki, promotes students who are active on the way to school, and arrive ready to learn, promotes making healthy lifestyle choices that will carry into adulthood, helps save money on petrol and is fun to do together with whānau, classmates and friends. As part of our challenge, we encourage our tamariki to bike to school or if unable to, bring a bike in to ride at lunch time. On Thursday 16th February we will be having a 'Pimp my Paihikara' day. When we encourage our tamariki to decorate their bikes and dress up. On this fun day there will be a parade and we will have a visit from Rotorua lakes Council with Ruru.

We are excited to be using the digital platform SeeSaw again this year across the school. Seesaw is a simple way for teachers and students to record and share what's happening as evidence to learning.

It gives students a place to document their learning, be creative and learn how to use technology effectively and purposefully. Each student gets their own journal (digital

portfolio) and will add things to it, like voice, photos, videos, drawings, or notes.



Students show learning and progress - Students use built-in multimodal tools to capture what they know or can do in Seesaw's digital portfolio.

Teachers gain insights - Teachers see all stages of student thinking and progress — enabling them to teach better.

Families connect - Families gain a window into their student's learning and engage in home-school partnerships. Seesaw also allows you to stay in touch with the school and your child's teacher through messages and announcements.




