STRIKE ACTION - THURSDAY 16TH MARCH 2023 - SCHOOL CLOSED

Just a reminder that we will be taking strike action on Thursday 16th March 2023. The Board has considered the availability of non-union teaching staff, and unfortunately decided that we can't provide normal instruction during the strike so the school will officially be closed for instruction on the day of the strike. Accordingly, it's important that you make alternative arrangements for the care of your child/children under 14 years of age during the period of the strike as no supervision can be provided.

We know that this is inconvenient for parents and students alike. Please be assured that student safety is our main concern. Thank you for your understanding.

Our tamariki need a quality education and we want to give that to them. Unfortunately, the funding for our schools and kindergartens is not enough for us to give us the time we would like to support all our kids to thrive. We need to attract and retain educators by ensuring that teaching is a valued and attractive profession.

Principals and teachers in primary and area schools and kindergartens have considered at length offers from the government to



But our schools and kindergartens are understaffed, and teachers and principals over-stretched.

Industrial action is a last resort. We are striking on 16 March to press the government to improve conditions, and to show the government we are serious about needing change.

Teachers' working conditions are your children's learning conditions.

We need:

- Improved support for tamariki
- · More staff to support learning
- Better recognition for the work primary teachers and principals do
- · Value and respect for our kindergarten teachers


STUDENT PICK UP AT 3PM - CHILD SAFETY




