PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – TERM 1 WEEK 8

Kia Ora Koutou, Dear Parents

Over the past week we have had Ako Kiwi Year 2 visiting the Rotorua Library for 'The Land of the Taniwha'. A group of Year 6 students are taking part in the Te Waiariki Purea Trust Hinemoa Water Safety Program. This program is designed to encourage children in making good and safe decisions around all waterways (i.e. lakes, rivers, beaches) and safely building on their experience and awareness when in the outdoors.

I was fortunate enough to be involved with Kick for a Cause - Rotorua's inaugural charitable football event, supporting the Salvation Army Foodbank.

Structured Literacy

At Otonga School, we use a **Structured Literacy** approach. Literacy learning involves explicitly teaching the critical skills needed to develop early reading and spelling development.

This approach differs from traditional methods. One difference that you will find is that the students will not bring a levelled book home, instead they will have their own tasks related to their learning needs. The children learn the letter-sound correspondences that match the 'decodable' books they will soon be reading. Then they will be shown how to blend these sounds together to read words like tip, tim, map and sit. They will also learn how to break words into individual sounds to help them spell. There are some 'heart words' (site words) that your child will be learning to memorise off by heart. To commit these to memory your child will need to practise daily. These types of activities will be in their home learning book. We also have many 'browsing books'- you can request from our classroom teachers At the next levels students will move onto The Code (Liz Kane)

The teachers will

- Explicitly teach how words work in both reading and writing
- Use specific decodable books that support the teaching focus
- Continue to use rich language and text to develop vocabulary and understand how books work

TikTok - ADVICE FOR PARENTS

It has come to our attention from some of our students that TikTok is being used <u>after school hours</u> and inappropriately. This is a video-sharing platform where you can watch and create videos, and livestream. **The app has an age-rating of 13+.**

There have been groups set up called '@otongashipsss' and '@someone.inotonga'. There are references to fighting and dating.

This is a heads up that parents should be having conversations about what students are doing online. Netsafe is a fantastic resource for this and you can find it here: Netsafe

WHAT ARE SOME OF THE ONLINE SAFETY CHALLENGES of TikTok?

TikTok accounts are public by default so anyone on the app can see what your child shares, but only approved followers can send messages. Some of the most common concerns with TikTok is that users can see inappropriate content or be contacted by people they don't know. For users under sixteen, TikTok defaults to having the direct messaging function turned off.

DOES TIKTOK HAVE ANY SAFETY FEATURES?

TikTok's Family Pairing feature is designed to protect children. You can control how long your child spends on TikTok, limit or turn off direct messaging and block potentially inappropriate content.

To do this:

- 1. Go to 'Privacy and Settings'
- 2. Under 'Digital Wellbeing' select 'Family Pairing'
- 3. Identify which phone belongs to the adult and the child

It is also worth exploring their <u>Safety Centre</u> either with your child or on your own so you can understand the experiences they are having. TikTok also list their <u>top ten tips for parents</u> and have <u>dedicated resources for parents</u> that you might want to read. It explains how to set up restricted mode or establish screen time limits.

NOTICE OF ROTORUA CENTRAL KAHUI AKO TEACHER ONLY DAY – Monday 24th April

Just a heads up that on Monday 24th April school will be closed for students for our first teacher only day in 2023. 





