Real-time Reporting on Student Progress

Real-time reporting enables parents and whānau to see their child's progress online, in real time. Ideally the process is driven by students with appropriate scaffolding by their teachers. It's about the learning process, and then the product.

Schools that have implemented a real-time reporting scheme report significant benefits for parent-teacher conferences. Deeper conversations about learning can take place straight away as the parents and teachers are always up to speed. 'McWilliams and Patton reveal that students whose parents receive regular and personalised messages with actionable information from teachers are more likely to succeed in school.'

SeeSaw is used as evidence for learning to show authentic progress across the curriculum whilst developing a unique, student-led set of evidence to celebrate progress and celebrate learning. The children are enjoying reading the comments from their teachers and whānau on their SeeSaw posts. It is great having so many positive and encouraging comments and feedback for the learning they are sharing.



Maxi	Years 5-6: Six on six games (with subs) on half of a turf	\$75 per person


Each team requires a coach and a manager. <u>If no coaches and managers, then teams will not be registered.</u>






