PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – TERM 3 WEEK 5

Kia Ora Koutou - Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Māori Educational Success

As required by the Education and Training Act, Otonga School's board ensures that every student at Otonga School is able to achieve their highest possible standard. Otonga School is also committed to te Tiriti o Waitangi and gives effect to te Tiriti by achieving equitable outcomes for ākonga Māori (Education and Training Act, s.127).











In order to help realise the purpose of Te Mātaiaho, embrace Te Reo and Te Ao Māori and to do things better, these are **some** of our achievements over the past three years:

- In 2021, our school made new history by joining The Rotorua Central Kahui Ako (RCKA)
 Community of Learning. Our Principal is now the co-lead Principal and leads the governance
 group with his colleagues from Glenholme School, RIS, Boys' High, Girls' High, Malfroy School,
 Ngakuru School, SDA School. This enables us to be part of Achievement Challenges, one
 being Culturally Responsive Pedagogy.
 - Our Leader of Māori works closely with the across school leaders from the Kahui Ako.
- Strategic planning in line with the National Education Learning Priorities (NELPS) for connection and growing relationships with Māori whānau to support involvement in our school.
- Employed culturally responsive staff who put relationships at the centre of learning and who value students' prior knowledge, culture, language and ways of making sense of the world.
- Introduced effective Teaching and Learning Through Play Pedagogy that honours Te Ao Māori
 and creates opportunities for Māori to be Māori. It recognises akonga as holders of taonga and
 mātauranga in the context of their learning. Kaiako, in the context of effective pedagogy, can
 bring rangatiratanga of Māori learners to the forefront, so that akonga are comfortable in
 bringing their iwitanga into their learning.
 - Play ensures equitable access to the curriculum, and values different world views, perspectives, experiences and measures of success.
- Eliminated streaming and put in its place a personalised, flexible model where all tamariki can progress and achieve at their own level and pace no matter where they start in their learning journey.
- Transformed our learning, assessment and reporting to formative practices using Otonga Progress Plans (OPPs) that value who our tamariki are, where they come from, what they bring to the learning and what their whānau aspirations are for learning, wellbeing and progress.
- Appointed a Leader of Māori and team with a strategic plan to lead this important kaupapa.
- Engaged tamariki with waiata and kapa haka (Junior and Senior Ropu) to perform at Ahurei.
 Tamariki enjoy schoolwide weekly Waiata practice.
- Started using the Wai Ako Resource schoolwide to ensure all students are learning Te Reo Māori.
- Enabled and supported our Teachers to enrol for <u>Te Ahu o te Reo Māori Te Taumata O Ngāti</u>
 Whakaue
- Connection to Te Tiriti o Waitangi is evident through our school values. Our school values are Māori values. These concepts are a shared language across our kura and linked to our graduate Year 6 student profile. These values are New Zealand values for all citizens.
- Our kura now uses He Pātaka Kōrero o Ngāti Whakaue as part of our Aotearoa NZ Histories Curriculum.
- Appointed a Leader of Aotearoa NZ Histories to bring this learning alive from 2023.

We take "Play" Seriously!

During our Matariki celebrations we made a collaborative manu tukutuku. Some children chose to follow the construction urge and design and build their own kites.

This involved much trial and error and experimenting with different designs, materials and test flights on Jackson Park. Through this play children were actively exploring concepts such as aerodynamics, balance, lift, weight and durability.

Soap Carving

Children were inspired by the carvings in the Wharenui at our recent overnight stay to Ōwhata Marae. Children were given the opportunity to sketch the carvings in the Wharenui. When we returned to school a number of children discussed the idea and desire to create their own carvings. This activated the idea of soap carvings and the urge of play through **Transformation** (turning something into something else). Children were given the chance to create their own soap carvings while experimenting with a variety of different tools.

Children were given the opportunity to experiment with traditional string games in preparation for our Marae visit. Children excelled in the art and were able to tell stories, create amazing designs, communicate and inspire others. They also demonstrated Tuakana-Teina by teaching the younger children. This demonstrates the play urge of **Transformation and Patterning**.



<u> Minecraft - Design a Wharenui</u>



Wharenui Design - Following on from our recent Noho Marae Trip, Students have designed and created their own Wharenui as a response to their experience. Using the maths skills learnt in our recent



geometry and measurement units they have shown their resourcefulness using recycled materials to build their individual

piece. They soon learnt working in pairs **Problem solving / collaboration** helped the process, rethinking and remaking many components until their structure were robust enough to paint and add extra details. A work in progress

Harrow Hardball Cricket (Year 4 to 6):


- HARD cricket ball, wooden bats and protective gear (helmets, gloves, batting pads etc) are used.

- Teams are required to have a coach and someone to score/umpire.




KINDO HELPDESK - Phone 0508 454 636


Kindo recommend that if you are having a problem using KINDO either on your computer or on the mobile phone app, that you contact the Kindo Helpdesk straight away. This way you can explain the exact problem you are having and KINDO can troubleshoot the issue while you are on the phone.

Issue s can arise for various reasons, usually they have to do with the web browser (Firefox/Safari/Google Chrome etc) or the app platform (such as Apple iPhone/Android Google Play) being used. Because of this the issues can be quite different and not the same for everyone.

OTONGA SCHOOLAPP - ABSENTEE EMAIL FUNCTION

A number of parents have contacted us to advise that they are having issues with our SchoolApp Absentee function, not being able to scroll down further on the screen to be able to type in a reason for the absentee. It seems this problem occurs if you are using an out-of-date version of our SchoolApp or if you are using an iPhone. Please make sure you are using the most current version of the SchoolApp, you may need to go to the Apple App Store or Google Play to download this. If you have an iPhone, when entering an absentee email, you need to select an 'Absent From' Date and click DONE before it will allow you to scroll further down. The 'Absent From' date automatically appears in the box, however you still need to click on this box, select a date and then click 'DONE'. If you have any further problems, please let us know.
