# We take "Play" Seriously! Ako Korimako Year 6

### **DRAMA**

In Room 20 we have been doing drama. We have been looking at the elements of drama and applying them. We have been playing with some of the conventions of drama such as creating freeze frames. We have created fictional character descriptions in our writing and then been able to play that character in role. We also created a whole class freeze frame. We will continue to integrate our drama and writing together over the coming weeks.

### Mokoia Island and Catfishing

The Year 6 students have the opportunity to visit Mokoia Island to continue their work around making New Zealand pest free. We emptied the traps at Mokoia Island and caught seven mice last week. It was also the first time to empty catfish nets at Lake Rotorua where we caught one catfish and the children were able to ask great questions to Keely from Te Arawa Lakes Trust and have a real hands on experience with the creatures in the lakes.



### Rakau and String Games

In room 22 we have been exploring and playing Maori games. Room 19 came and taught us how to play with rakau which was great fun but very noisy. We also discovered many interesting string patterns which we used to tell stories like Ihenga.



Room 21 has been exploring the way that Maori came to New Zealand. We read the story of Kupe's voyage and investigated what he used to get to Aotearoa New Zealand then we researched and made our own models of Waka Hourua. We had a lot of fun testing our models to see if they would float and whether they could carry a weight of 200 grams and two lego people.

### Netball - Term 4



### Rippa/Rip Rugby - Term 4




### KINDO HELPDESK - Phone 0508 454 636


Kindo recommend that if you are having a problem using KINDO either on your computer or on the mobile phone app, that you contact the Kindo Helpdesk straight away. This way you can explain the exact problem you are having and KINDO can troubleshoot the issue while you are on the phone.

Issue s can arise for various reasons, usually they have to do with the web browser (Firefox/Safari/Google Chrome etc) or the app platform (such as Apple iPhone/Android Google Play) being used. Because of this the issues can be quite different and not the same for everyone.

### OTONGA SCHOOLAPP - ABSENTEE EMAIL FUNCTION

A number of parents have contacted us to advise that they are having issues with our SchoolApp Absentee function, not being able to scroll down further on the screen to be able to type in a reason for the absentee. It seems this problem occurs if you are using an out-of-date version of our SchoolApp or if you are using an iPhone. Please make sure you are using the most current version of the SchoolApp, you may need to go to the Apple App Store or Google Play to download this. If you have an iPhone, when entering an absentee email, you need to select an 'Absent From' Date and click DONE before it will allow you to scroll further down. The 'Absent From' date automatically appears in the box, however you still need to click on this box, select a date and then click 'DONE'. If you have any further problems, please let us know.
