## We take Play Seriously!

## Ako Kereru Year 4

**Pirate Play** - Kereru Ako (Year 4) has been continuing their learning theme of 'Journeys' into the world of *Pirates*!



Over a few weeks classes researched using *reading* skills about the history of pirates. We discovered the parts of the world where pirates roamed (*mapping*), the different roles pirates had on their ships (*organisation*), they discovered the types of ships, weapons and food pirates had and what the life of a pirate was like, including severe punishments! Students also learnt about some

interesting characters who became famous pirates. They shared their learning with the rest of their class using *drawing*, *writing* and *presenting* skills.





Outside Play sessions using the Magic Box led into *writing* imaginary stories titled 'The day I joined a Pirate Ship' and 'stranded on a desert island' motivation for *writing* is much higher when playing and *acting out* is done as a *pre-writing* activity.



The pinnacle of our pirate learning was on *International 'Talk like a Pirate Day'*. All three classes joined together for a day of *song, drama, play and challenges*. We warmed up all together by singing Pirate songs and played Pirate games, creating a sense of *whanaungatanga*. Next children could choose to prepare for pirate fun by *constructing* weapons, clothing, ships and hideouts. *Making huts* is a play urge and constructing a 'base' or ship creates a setting for the play. They were

engaged in pirate play, *climbing, running, jumping and wrestling*. *Strategy and communication* was needed to 'attack' and 'steal' other pirates' treasure! Students were also able to opt into activities such as 'tug of war', walk the plank and three-legged races. Creating treasure maps used *literacy and numeracy skills*. The *transformation urge* was utilised to change water into 'pirate punch', a tasty pirate drink! *Burying and digging play-urges* were satisfied in the sandpit, trying to find the pirate treasure. Finally there was a *numeracy estimation* challenge to guess how much treasure was in a jar... We also gathered around to crack coconuts and try a bit! We needed *manawanui* to crack them open, then we were rewarded with a pirate feast! ***A fun, learning experience for me hearties!***

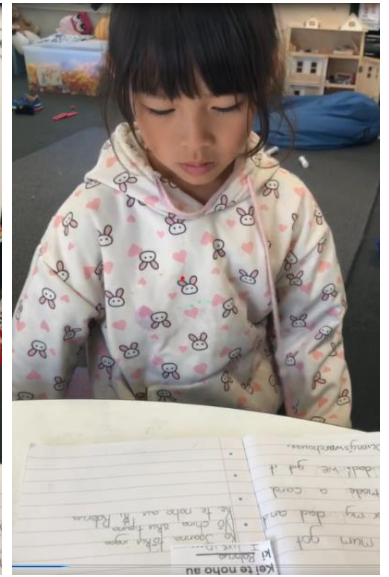




# Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori

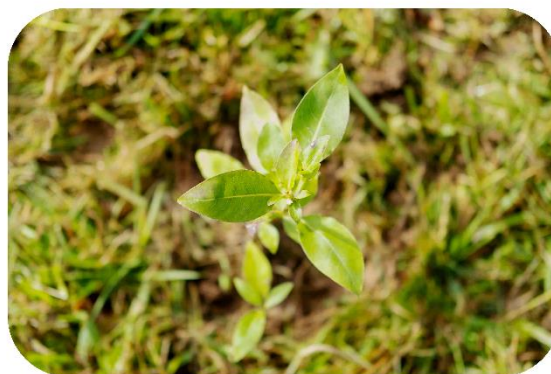


### PLANTING DAY SUMMARY:

#### 100 x Ti Kouka

(Cabbage Tree / *Cordyline australis*)

Being one of our most iconic natives, Ti Kouka trees were an important food source and weaving plant for early settlers in NZ. It can be found throughout NZ from sea level up to 600m elevation. Tui and kererū enjoy its fruit in the summer.



#### 150 x Harakeke

(Flax / *Phormium tenax*)

Flax grows well in a wide range of habitats and is abundantly found throughout NZ. Its flower stalks can grow up to 4m tall and tui and bellbird are especially fond of the nectar.



#### 130 x Karamu

(*Coprosma robusta*)

Common throughout NZ and easily recognised by its bright orange fruit, Karamu grows up to 6m tall and provides food for birds in winter. It easily self-seeds which makes it a great plant for many restoration projects.



#### 150 x Manuka

(*Leptospermum scoparium*)

Manuka is a great plant for restoration projects. It is a hardy plant that can live almost anywhere in NZ from Cape Reinga to Stewart Island and from wetlands to dry banks. It also an important medical plant.



#### 100 x Kanuka

(*Kunzea robusta*)

Kanuka looks similar to manuka but is a larger tree rather than a shrub, growing up to 15m tall with beautiful white aromatic flowers in summer. It is a great colonizer and once grown tall, it provides a canopy for smaller natives.



### What is Trees for Survival?

Trees for Survival is a Rotary initiated charitable trust which works with over 190 schools and local communities across Aotearoa New Zealand to grow and plant native trees along waterways and environmentally at-risk sites.

Trees for Survival's environmental education programme provides a hands-on opportunity for students to make a practical difference to their environment as well as learn about conservation, revegetation, wetland restoration, protecting stream water quality and creating habitat for our native wildlife.

Kindo recommend that if you are having a problem using KINDO either on your computer or on the mobile phone app, that you contact the Kindo Helpdesk straight away. This way you can explain the exact problem you are having and KINDO can troubleshoot the issue while you are on the phone.



Issues can arise for various reasons, usually they have to do with the web browser (Firefox/Safari/Google Chrome etc) or the app platform (such as Apple iPhone/Android Google Play) being used. Because of this the issues can be quite different and not the same for everyone.

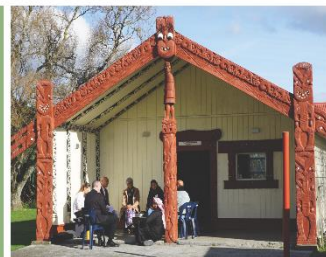
